CHAIRPERSONS REPORT – for AGM 24th MAY 2018.

This report is a brief account of our activities during the past year. We continue to hold monthly committee meeting and have had regular dealings with Councillors and Council Officials as required. We are affiliated to Terenure 2030 which is an umbrella body for the Residents Associations in the immediate area of Terenure Village as well as the Terenure Traders.

Terenure 2030

The Men's Shed is now up and running with two new sheds in the grounds of the Evergreen Club. The group meets every Wednesday afternoon and is always seeking new members. The Evergreen Club run Art/Bridge and Exercise classes every week as well as Mother and Toddler groups. Lunches are served on Mondays and Wednesdays for elderly people. Our Annual Dog Show will be held on 9th June at 12pm, and our Annual Family Fun Day is on Saturday 8th September from 11-4pm; both of these events will be held in Bushy Park. We are always seeking volunteers to help at these events so please contact us if you're available to help.

Dublin City Council

Again this year Terenure has received huge support from Dublin City Council (DCC) and in recognition of this I have invited Rob Chester, Senior Community Officer at DCC, to outline plans for the coming year. He will provide an update on the main achievements over the last twelve months. I would like to pay a very special thanks to DCC for all their help over the last year. They supplied us with brushes, bags, gloves, and pickers which we distributed for the collection of leaves etc. Over the winter period, DCC responded on every occasion within a few hours of a call to collect the bags of leaves and clear blocked drains which were reported to them.

TRA Web Site

The web-site is maintained and kept right up to date by John Grant. We post new and useful information regularly and now find that it is the go to place for many people to find out what's happening in their area. Garda Liaison Office

Barbara our Liaison Officer meets with the Gardaí every month and reports back to the Committee. The Gardaí have asked that any crime no matter how small be reported to them. Dublin City Neighbourhoods and Tidy Town Competitions:

Terenure scored 286 points in this year's National Tidy Towns Competition which was the same score as last year – so still a lot of room for improvement. In the Dublin City Neighbourhood Competition our Area received first prize in the Business category and progressed to the finals of the

Pride of Place category held in Donegal in December. Despite the sterling efforts of all concerned, sadly we were unsuccessful.

Planning Officer

Terenure Roads and Traffic

We have been asked by the Rathgar Residence Association to join up with them and all surrounding associations in their efforts to organise an action plan to increase the pressure on Dublin to bring back a service of buses to the Stephen Green and Trinity area. I would like to thank Mary Freehill and Claire O'Connor for their efforts to have the buses rerouted back to St. Stephens Green.

New Committee Members

As ever we would love to have some new members from the roads not presently represented to ensure inclusivity. We meet on the first Tuesday of each month excluding January, July and August. New faces and ideas are very welcomed so please let me know if you are interested.

Finally, I would like to thank you all for your presence here this evening, our committee for their work and support.
