

Busconnects - UPDATE

The Bus Connects project continues to be rolled out across Dublin City. The network redesign (bus routes) is being implemented in stages. To date, 3 new Spines have commenced: Spine G (serving Ballyfermot, Liffey Valley, Clondalkin, Islandbridge), Spine H (serving Howth, Baldoyle, Donaghmede, Raheny, Malahide, Portmarnock) and SpineC (serving Maynooth, Celbridge, Leixlip, Lucan, Adamstown, Liffey Valley and Palmerstown, Ringsend and Sandymount). North side orbital routes (N) have also been launched as well as some 24-hour services.

There is no indication yet as to when the A Spine (serving Terenure) will be launched, however, the Southside Orbitals are set to go live in February with the S4 running from Liffey Valley to UCD via Terenure Road West, Terenure Road East and Highfield Road. The nearby S6 will run from Tallaght to Blackrock via Butterfield Avenue, Grange Road and Nutgrove Avenue. Statutory Planning Applications have been made to An Bord Pleanála for Core Bus Corridors (infrastructure) Lucan-City Centre,

Ballymun/Finglas-City Centre, Liffey Valley-City Centre, Blanchardstown-City Centre, Belfield/Blackrock-City Centre and Clongriffin-City Centre.

Closer to home, the NTA has reviewed and considered all submissions from the non-statutory consultations on preferred route options and is currently finalising the preliminary design for the Kimmage to City Centre and the Templeogue / Rathfarnham to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Schemes. In addition, Environmental Impact Assessment Reports, inclusive of traffic impact analyses, are being completed for the Schemes. Once finished, these reports will be the basis for their applications to An Bord Pleanála (ABP), together with the Compulsory Purchase Order, Schedules and Maps. Work remains ongoing in finalising the preliminary design for the Schemes and the associated documentation in preparation for formal statutory planning application to ABP in the first half of 2023.

ROADS and TRAFFIC

Below is a response from the Traffic Dept following on from a survey they did last December.....re. Illegal parking, traffic congestion chaos etc etc in Rathdown.... As a result of this meeting on Oct. 10th 2022... they are now placing the onus on the Residents to produce the relevant documentation.

TEXT OF RESPONSE

"The Rathdown traffic review showed support from 60% of residents of Rathdown Estate for changes to the existing Pay & Display & Permit Parking Scheme on Rathdown Avenue. It is now proposed to amend the existing scheme, however, in order to amend an existing scheme, an application must be submitted to Dublin City Council, along with supporting documentation showing 35% of residents on Rathdown Avenue are in support of amending the scheme. See link below to criteria for a new Pay & Display and Permit Parking Scheme, the same information is required for extending an existing scheme" www.dublincity.ie/residential/parking-dublin-city-centre/start-parking-scheme/criteria

As you can see this is a completely unacceptable response from the traffic dept, who have been told by one and all that this a Rathdown problem and not just the avenue. We have written to them once again to point this fact out, Councillors Anne Feeney and Deirdre Conroy are still pressing to have this matter resolved satisfactory.

Terenure Men's Shed




